SUPER BOWL LIV PREVIEW

50 YEARS OF THE AFC vs THE NFC

Similar to the pride that college conferences have when they play non-conference competition during the regular season and in bowl games, the AFC and NFC take pride in their conference when playing each other during the regular season and in the Super Bowl. Below we list the all-time records between the AFC and the NFC in regular season interconference competition since the AFL and NFL merged beginning with the 1970 season. On the left we list the season-by-season won-loss records between the AFC and NFC. We list the all-time conference leader after each season so you can see how the series progressed over the years. From 1970 through the 2019 season (50 total seasons), the AFC has built a commanding 1,398-1,313-13 .516 all-time lead. The AFC has won the head-to-head matchup vs the NFC 28 times, the NFC has won the head-to-head matchup vs the AFC 14 times and in 8 seasons the AFC & NFC have split the interconference games equally.
